

## **Culture – Summary**

The Bible speaks about God having a Chosen People. Today that sentiment is very much alive amongst the Jewish people. It is a bond that binds all Jewish people together. There may be differences of expression, different rabbis may be followed, traditions and customs may vary but, in essence, being Jewish is inextricably intertwined with being God's Chosen People.

Jewish people may hold to different worldviews, yet culture and identity are important to most. Family, food, community, religion and ethics are the glue that hold Jewish communities together. Sometimes the Bible may be important but equally the Bible may not be central in a Jewish person's life. Oftentimes it could be the Siddur, the Jewish Prayer book that is more well known.

The key thing is to understand is that there is not one fixed form of Jewishness; everyone is unique. We can discover this by showing genuine interest and asking friendly questions to our Jewish friend. Learning about culture is important and it is an essential way to pave the way for Gospel conversations.
