1.1 God is King

Purpose

To show the wider biblical framework that God is king.

Prayer points

<u>Thank</u> God that He is King; He is 'before all things and in Him all things hold together.' He is the Sovereign Lord and he has a plan (<u>Colossians 1</u>).

<u>Pray</u> that a deeper understanding of these things may become embedded in Christian-Jewish relations.

<u>Intercede</u> for the Jewish people that they would be drawn deeper to the Scriptures that point to the Messiah who came to fulfil the commission of the King.

God is truly a great King! He is, as the Siddur* or the Jewish prayer book, puts it: King of the Universe. This is a fundamental truth that both Christian and Jewish theology emphasise.
