

# Kingdom Reflection & Study Notes

# 1.2 The Message of the King

## **Purpose**

To demonstrate that it was always God's intention for Jewish people to announce good news to Gentile\* people. Therefore, the Gospel can be brought back to the Jewish people.

#### **Scriptures**

Psalm 117 – The call for Gentile worship

Exodus 12:38, Leviticus 19:34 - At Sinai there were Jews and Gentiles

1 Kings 8:41-43, Ezekiel 5:5 - The Jewish nation is at the centre

<u>Isaiah 42:1–9</u>; <u>Isaiah 49:1–6</u>; <u>Isaiah 50:4–11</u> and <u>Isaiah 52:13–53:12</u>.- Isaiah's 4 servant

songs. These passages mention the 'many', meaning 'the nations'

Romans 1:16, Matthew 28:16-20 – In the New Testament, it is natural for Jewish

believers to tell Gentiles about the Saviour - see Isaiah 52:7

Numbers 20:1, Psalm 82:1, Exodus 12:3 – A congregation in the desert

Book of Acts – Jewish people telling Gentile people the Gospel (so what is so odd about Gentile people returning the favour and bringing back the Gospel to the Jewish people?)

Ephesians 2:11-17 – The one new man

Psalm 67 – The fulness of the message

## **Bible Study Reflection Questions**

- 1) Which Bible verses impacted you most from this video? How?
- 2) What have you learnt about the consistency of the Old and New Testaments from this video?
- 3) Why is the term 'Gospel' (Good News) found in the Hebrew Bible (or the 'Old Testament')? What does this tell you about the character of God?
- 4) What would it look like for all the nations to praise God in the fullest sense (Psalm 67)?
- 5) Does the picture painted in Psalm 67 impact your vision of God? How does it motivate you to live for Him in a deeper way?
- 6) How does what you have learnt here give you confidence in sharing the Good News with Jewish people?
- 7) Which person do you think needs you to share this message with them this week? How will you do that?

#### **Prayer points**

<u>Thank</u> God that He is King. He alone has decreed his Word and we must listen to Him (Deuteronomy 18:14-19).

<u>Pray</u> that believers in Yeshua would have a deeper understanding of God and place a greater value on the Gospel message of the Good King.

<u>Intercede</u> for the Jewish people - that those who have not heard would be drawn into loving fellowship with their Maker (<u>Isaiah 53:1</u>).

God has indeed a great salvation message to share and it truly is good news, or בְּשׂוֹרָה besorah in Hebrew!
